The UT Gardens, Jackson, is holding its amaryllis bulb sale on Tuesday, November 11th from noon to 4:00PM. Members of the UT Gardens are invited to a pre-sale on Monday, November 10th from noon to 3:00PM. If you are not a member you can become one for \$35 on the 10th and shop.

We have 26 different kinds of amaryllis for a total of over 500 bulbs for this sale. Most bulbs will be 13-14 inches in circumference. Bulbs that size often produce three flowering stalks and sometimes four. They will be \$22.00 each, including tax. Bags of potting soil will be available for \$3.00. We will also have select trees, shrubs, conifers and perennials available. Plants highlighted in green will be buy two get one free mix or match equal or lesser value. Cash or check preferred.
